**Grade 4 Language Arts Example Items** are a **representative set** of items for the ACP. Teachers may use this set of items along with the test blueprint as guides to prepare students for the ACP. On the last page, the correct answer, content SE and SE justification are listed for each item.

On the Example set and the ACP, Figure 19 SEs are bundled with the TEKS Strand for the genre of the passage tested. The items with bundled SEs on the Example set are representative of those on the ACP but may *not* be inclusive of all possible bundled SEs. The ACP Blueprint does show all Figure 19 bundled SEs assessed on the ACP. *Also, the specific part of an SE that an Example Item measures is **NOT** necessarily the only part of the SE that is assessed on the ACP.* None of these Example Items will appear on the ACP.

Read the selection and choose the best answer for each question.

*Billy's teacher asked each student to write about a job. Read Billy's paper and look for corrections and improvements he should make. Then answer the questions that follow.*

### Plumbers

(1) "Glub, glub! (2) What does that sound mean? (3) No, it's not the sound of your pet telling you it's hungry. (4) It means it is time to call a plumber.

(5) The pipe is stopped up, and water is unable to pass through.

(21) The work of a plumber takes a longer time to learn. (22) Someone who wants to be a new plumber starts out working with an experienced plumber.

(23) This person is called a master plumber.

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(24) A learning plumber usually works about five years with a master plumber. (25) The new plumber learns right on the job. (26) The new plumber learns the skills to be a good plumber. (27) Money can be earned as learning takes place. (28) Many people take classes to learn about plumbing.

(29) The new plumber must take a test. (30) Then the new plumber is able to start a business. (31) The new plumber may go to work for a plumbing company.

(32) Plumbers have tools that they use as they work. (33) One of their busiest tools is the adjustable wrench. (34) Its jaws can be made bigger or smaller to fit different sizes of pipes. (35) Plumbers need to cut pipes they use a pipe cutter. (36) Pipes are joined together with a propane torch. (37) Drains are cleared with a coiled wire called a snake. (38) Some plumbers use a small video camera that can be lowered or pushed many foots into drains or pipes to see what is causing a problem inside. (39) Then the plumber can decide the best way to take care of the problem.

(40) Plumbers work on homes, stores, apartment buildings, factories, tall skyscrapers, and construction sites. (41) Plumbers have many tools. (42) They help keep water supplys safe and healthy.
